A. INTRODUCTION

The Housing Authority of the City of Camden (hereinafter referred to as "HACC") is a public entity that was formed in 1938 to provide federally subsidized housing and housing assistance to low-income families within Camden City. The HACC is headed by an Executive Director (ED) and is governed by a five-person board of commissioners. The HACC is subject to the requirements of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations (hereinafter, "CFR"), HUD Handbook 7460.8 REV 2 (Procurement Handbook for Public Housing Agencies and N.J.S.A. 40A:11 et seq. (Local Public Contracts Law) and N.J.A.C. 5:34 (Local Public Contracts Law Regulations).

In keeping with its mandate to provide efficient and effective services, the HACC is soliciting proposals from qualified and licensed firms to provide fee accountant services. All proposals submitted in response to this solicitation must conform to all of the requirements and specifications outlined within this document and any designated attachments in its entirety.

B. SCOPE OF SERVICE

The successful firm shall provide the following services in accordance with set monthly and annual accounting cycles.

1. Process all documents required for budget and operating subsidy preparation, including subsidy calculation; budget forms; utility estimates; all required HUD forms; reporting; and PHAS financial internet submissions. Preparation of the HACC budgets shall include at least one revision.
2. Review and analyze all operations necessary to maintain the general ledgers and subsidiary ledgers for the Housing Authority, in accordance with the procedures outlined by the HACC's administration, including the following services:
 - i. Review the bank statements reconciliation on a monthly basis;
 - ii. Prepare and review necessary journal vouchers on a monthly basis;
 - iii. Prepare and review reports and balance sheets, and maintain the general ledgers on a month basis, as required by Federal, State and/or local laws, statutes or regulations;
 - iv. Review controls of cost and finances;
 - v. Provide financial records, statements and assistance for the Annual Independent Audit; and other audits as necessary;
 - vi. Prepare all debt service entries;
 - vii. Prepare all monthly, quarterly; semi-annual and year-end financial statements and annual closing entries;

- viii. Maintain investment and insurance registers;
 - ix. Maintain property ledger/capitalized equipment; and
 - x. Maintain capital funds subsidiary ledgers as required by HUD and subsidiary ledgers for any development funds or grant monies awarded.
3. Complete the close out for the fiscal year to include the preparation of all forms required by HUD and transmission of the Financial Data Schedule (FDS) to Real Estate Assessment Center (REAC).
 4. Review PHA investments, report and make recommendation(s) to the Executive Director on such matters.
 5. Must be compliant with PHA Asset Management provisions, rules and regulations.
 6. Prepare FASS financial data and submit to REAC.
 7. Assist in the preparation of the PHAS Certification to REAC.
 8. Review financial records and prepare statements as requested for all LLC non-profit corporations.
 9. Prepare and submit all financial forms, reports and statements as required by HUD, in accordance with the scheduled list in HUD 7475.1 REV.
 10. Must be available to conduct on-site visits in order to provide clarifications on pertinent financial matters relative to questions posed by members of the Board of Commissioners, the Auditor, the Executive Director and/or other HACC staff. The successful firm must be available as needed to answer questions an auditor or HUD representative may have regarding the financial records of the HACC.
 11. Prepare financial status reports of all programs to be presented to the Board of Commissioners at year end.
 12. Inform the Executive Director of any matters that come to their attention which causes them to believe that any errors, irregularities or illegal acts may exist.
 13. The fee accounting services provided, must be in accordance with Generally Accepted Account Procedures (GAPP) and reporting provisions of applicable HUD and REAC guidelines for use in auditing purposes and Single Audit Act A-133.

C. QUALIFICATIONS OF RESPONDENTS

1. All Respondents responding to this Request for Proposals (RFP) shall have a minimum of five (5) years demonstrated experience providing fee accounting services to Housing Authorities.
2. Respondents shall possess all State and Federal licenses and/or certifications required to provide the requested services.

D. CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract shall be for a term of two (2) years. At the discretion of the Board of Commissioners, the contract may be extended for an additional one (1) year term.

F. FEE SCHEDULE - PAYMENT

Respondents shall list separately any proposed items to be listed as reimbursable expenses which are billed separately.

Invoices for services performed under the agreement resulting from this solicitation shall be submitted on a monthly (30 day) basis. All invoices submitted for payment shall include the following information:

- The specific matter being billed (e.g. "various employment matters" is not acceptable).
- The period of time for which the statement is rendered.
- A brief description of the services rendered.
- The names of each associate, or clerk performing the services.
- The number of hours or portions of hours spent by each person each day.
- The hourly billing rate for each person whose time is included on the invoice.
- Disbursements, broken down by category.
- The total for the billing period.
- The total amount that has been billed on the matter prior to the current billing period.

G. PRESENTATION PACKAGE – Submit with the RFP Response

The HACC seeks from all participating Respondents, information that will assist the authority in selecting the respondent who will provide the highest quality services at a fair and competitive price.

All respondents shall prepare a presentation package to be submitted with the RFP.

The Presentation Package shall include at a minimum the following:

I. Management Criteria

A. Business Organization

The respondent shall submit a full description of the business organization to include, but not be limited to:

- Name, address, phone, fax, website, e-mail address and other information of the professional agency or individual;
- Resumes of key staff members; and

- Other information concerning individuals of the professional firm that would assist the authority in the evaluation process.
- Professional Liability – Include proof of Professional Liability naming the Housing Authority of the City of Camden as additional insured with a minimum liability of \$1,000,000. The HACC shall be held harmless for any activities covered under the scope of this contract.
- In order to ensure acceptable service, the authority requires the bidder to specify a contact person assigned to the authority's account. If the contact person changes for any reason, the authority must be notified in writing.

B. Qualifications: Relevant Experience

Respondents shall submit documentation highlighting qualifications and experience they have that will assist the housing authority in the evaluation and selection process. Such documentation shall include, but shall not be limited to:

- Evidence of providing services as listed in the scope of work to housing authorities for a minimum of five (5) years.
- Three (3) letters of recommendation (do not include the HACC);
- List current contracts with other housing authorities or agencies providing comparable services.
- Copies of all professional licenses that are required to perform the services as listed in the scope of work;
- List of any judgments within the last three (3) years and/or a list of bankruptcy or organization proceedings within the last ten (10) years;
- Other information concerning the agency and/or individuals of the agency that would assist the authority in the evaluation process.
- Availability of personnel, facilities, equipment and other resources to provide the services requested.
- Include the name and resume of the staff assigned to the authority's contract.

II. Technical Criteria

Description of Services

- A. should list all services to be rendered with their explanation in detail on how they will provide the services. Respondents shall also provide evidence of how services of similar type were provided to other authorities and/or agencies. (Success stories only). By submitting a proposal, the firm acknowledges that they fully understand the scope of service, work and activities to be performed. Respondents should provide evidence of any innovation and/or successful approach in providing the services requested.

III. Cost Criteria

A. Schedule of Hourly Rates

All are to submit a fee proposal schedule that compliments the service that is being requested by the authority. The authority is requesting hourly rates for the services requested in this RFP. The proposal form requesting the hourly rates is included in the RFP.

A. Contract Expenses

Respondents are to note the following as it pertains to expenses related to the contract:

- **Expenses; Related to Contract; Incidental**

All incidental expenses related to this contract, incurred by the agency to which the contract is awarded, shall be the responsibility of the agency. The HACC will not reimburse any vendor for any incidental expenses related to the contract.

- **Extraordinary Expenses**

Extraordinary expenses to be incurred by the agency in the performance of his/her duties may be brought to the HACC prior to the actual expenditure. The HACC Board, upon recommendation of the appropriate administrator, may consider reimbursing the expense, or the HACC may procure the services separately.

H. EVALUATION PROCESS; METHODOLOGY OF AWARDING CONTRACT

All RFP responses shall be evaluated on the basis of whose response is the most advantageous to the authority, price and other factors considered, and whose response will provide the highest quality of service at fair and competitive prices.

The HACC will use a one hundred (100) point system in evaluating all proposals. The criteria to be evaluated are identified below:

K. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

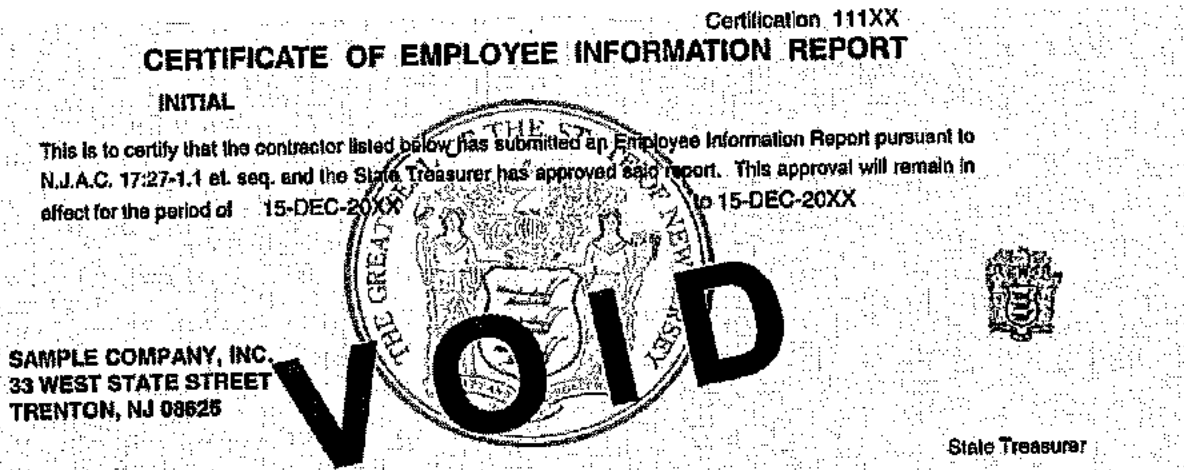
Please note: A completed and signed Affirmative Action Questionnaire is required with submission of bid/proposal. However, the HACC will accept in lieu of the Questionnaire, Affirmative Action Evidence in the form of a current Certificate of Employee Information Report submitted with the bid/proposal.

Each respondent shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

- i. Appropriate evidence that the respondent is operating under an existing federally approved or sanctioned affirmative action program; or
- ii. A certificate of employee information report approval issued in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-4; or
- iii. An employee information report (Form AA302) provided by the Division and distributed to the public agency to be completed by the contractor, in accordance with N.J.A.C.17:27-4.

Please note: A completed and signed Affirmative Action Questionnaire is required with submission of proposal. However, the HACC will accept in lieu of the Questionnaire, an Evidence of Affirmative Action certificate stapled to the Affirmative Action Questionnaire form.



"If awarded a contract your company/agency will be required to comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27 et. seq.

L. AUTHORIZATION TO WORK - PURCHASE ORDER REQUIRED

No service shall be rendered unless the successful respondent receives an approved purchase order authorizing the respondent to render the service or a contract signed by the Executive Director of the HACC.

M. BUSINESS REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE (N.J.S.A. 52:32-44)

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-44 as amended by P.L. 2004 - Chapter 57, all respondents shall submit with their proposal package a copy of their "New Jersey Business Registration Certificate" as issued by the Department of Treasury of the State of New Jersey. Failure to provide the New Jersey Business Registration Certification with the proposal package, or prior to the award of contract, will be cause for the rejection of the entire proposal.



Goods and Services Contracts

N.J.S.A. 52:32-44 imposes the following requirements on contractors and all subcontractors that **knowingly** provide goods or perform services for a contractor fulfilling this contract: 1) The contractor shall provide written notice to its subcontractors to submit proof of business registration to the contractor; 2) prior to receipt of final payment from a contracting agency, a contractor must submit to the contracting agency an accurate list of all subcontractors or attest that none was used;

3) during the term of this contract, the contractor and its affiliates shall collect, remit, and notify all subcontractors and their affiliates that they must collect and remit to the Director of the New Jersey Division of Taxation, the use tax due pursuant to the Sales and Use Tax Act, (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq.) on all sales of tangible personal property delivered into this State.

A contractor, subcontractor or supplier who fails to provide proof of business registration or provides false business registration information shall be liable to a penalty of \$25 for each day of violation, not to exceed \$50,000 for each business registration not properly provided or maintained under a contract with a contracting agency. Information on the law and its requirements is available by calling (609) 292-9292.

N. CONTRACTS

Upon notification of award of contract by the Housing Authority of the City of Camden, the successful respondent shall sign and execute a formal contract agreement with the HACC.

The successful respondent shall sign and execute said contract and return it together with documents required by the district such as but not limited to:

- Professional Liability Certificate;
- Criminal History Background evidence;
- Other required documents as may be outlined in the proposal specifications.

Within ten (10) days of receipt of notification of award of contract, the executed contracts and related documents must be returned to:

O. DOCUMENTS, MISSING/ILLEGIBLE

The respondent shall familiarize himself with all forms* provided by the HACC that are to be returned with the proposal. If there are any forms either missing or illegible, it is the responsibility of the respondent to contact the Purchasing Manager at (856.968.2724) for duplicate copies of the forms. This must be done before the proposal submission. The HACC accepts no responsibility for duplicate forms that were not received by the respondent in time for the respondent to submit with his proposal.

P. DOCUMENT SIGNATURES – ORIGINAL; BLUE INK

All documents returned to the HACC shall be signed with an original signature in ink (blue). Failure to sign and return all required documents with the bid package may be cause for disqualification and for the bid to be rejected pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2:2(33) (non-responsive). The HACC will not accept facsimile or rubber stamp signatures.

Q. EVALUATION OF CRITERIA

The authority intends to evaluate all proposals on the basis of the responses that are most advantageous to the authority, price and other factors considered. Included in the evaluation process, but not limited to be the following criteria:

- Experience and ability to perform services;
- Qualifications and references;
- Organization; staffing; facilities;
- Cost proposal;
- Other factors demonstrated in the respondent's presentation package that may be in the best interests of the HACC.

R. FALSE MATERIAL REPRESENTATION – N.J.S.A. 2C:21-34-97(b)

A person commits a crime if the person knowingly makes a material representation that is false in connection with the negotiation, award or performance of a government contract. If the contract amount is for \$25,000.00 or above, the offender is guilty of a crime of the second degree. If the contract amount exceeds \$2,500.00, but is less than \$25,000.00, the offender is guilty of a crime of the third degree. If the contract amount is for \$2,500.00 or less, the offender is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

S. INCIDENTAL EXPENSES

All incidental expenses related to the services provided are the responsibility of professional service provider. The HACC will not reimburse any provider for any incidental expenses related to the contract.

Travel – The proposal costs submitted by respondents shall include any or all costs pertaining to travel to and from any site where the services are to be performed. The Housing Authority of the City of Camden will not pay any costs for travel. Travel time is not to be charged on any hourly or service rate. Travel time to and from the site of service is to be borne by the respondent.

T. INSURANCE; PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY – CERTIFICATE REQUIRED

U. INTERPRETATIONS AND ADDENDA

No interpretation of the meaning of the specifications will be made to any Respondent orally. Every request for such interpretations should be made in writing to the Purchasing Manager and must be received at least ten (10) days prior to the date fixed for the opening of proposals to be given consideration. Any and all interpretations and any supplemental instructions will be distributed in the form of written addenda to the specifications. The addenda will be provided in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A11-23(c) to the respondents by certified mail or certified fax no later than seven (7) days Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of proposals. All addenda so issued shall become part of the contract document.

V. POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE STATEMENT – PAY TO PLAY

A business entity as defined by law is advised of its responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement on political contributions with the **New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission** pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 (P.L. 2005 Chapter 271 section 3) if the business entity receives contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. It is the business entity's responsibility to determine if filing is necessary. Award of Contract -- Reportable Contributions

"The HACC will not vote upon or award any contract in the amount of \$17,500 or greater to any business entity which has made a contribution reportable by the recipient under P.L.1973, c83 (codified at N.J.S.A. 19:44A-1 et. seq.) to a member of the HACC Board of Commissioners during the preceding one-year period."

Contributions During Term of Contract - Prohibited -- N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-6.3 (a2, 3)
"Contributions reportable by the recipient under P.L. 1973, c83 (codified at N.J.S.A. 19:44A-1 et. seq.) to any member of the board of commissioners, from any business entity doing business with the HACC are prohibited during the term of the contract."

When a business entity referred in 4.1(e) is a natural person, contribution by that person's spouse or child that resides therewith, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity. When a business entity is other than a natural person, a contribution by any person or other business entity having an interest therein shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity."

Chapter 271 Political Contribution Disclosure Form

All bidders shall submit with their bid package a completed and signed Chapter 271 Political Contribution Disclosure Form. The Chapter 271 form will be reviewed by the district to determine whether the vendor is in compliance.

AA. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

If the HACC determines that the contractor has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the bid and/or proposal upon which the issuance of the contract is based or that the contractor has failed to perform said service, duties and or responsibilities in a timely, proper, professional and/or efficient manner, then the HACC shall have the authority terminate the contract upon written notice setting forth the reason for termination and effective date of termination.

Termination by the HACC of the contract does not absolve the contractor from potential liability for damages caused to the authority by the contractor's breach of this agreement. The HACC may withhold payment due the contractor and apply same towards damages once established. The HACC will act diligently in accordance with governing statutes to mitigate damages. Damages may include the additional cost of procuring said services or goods from other sources.

The contractor further agrees to indemnify and hold the Authority harmless from any liability to subcontractors or suppliers concerning work performed or goods provided arising out of the lawful termination of this agreement.

BB. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS

Before the Proposal Due Date

The HACC may consider a written request from a respondent to withdraw a proposal if the written request is received by the Purchasing Manager before the proposal due date. Any respondent who has been granted permission by the Purchasing Manager to have his/her proposal withdrawn cannot re-submit a proposal for the same project.

After the Proposal Due Date

The HACC may consider a written request from a respondent to withdraw a proposal if the written request is received by the Purchasing Manager within five (5) business days after the proposal opening. A request to withdraw a proposal after the specified number of days will not be honored. The respondent who wishes to withdraw a proposal must provide a certification supported by written factual evidence that an error or omission was made by the respondent and that the error or omission was a substantial computational error or an unintentional omission or both.

The request to withdraw a proposal after the proposal due date may be reviewed by the Purchasing Manager, the interested administrators; and/or the HACC Attorney, and a recommendation will be made to the HACC.

The HACC will be the final determining authority in permitting the proposal to be withdrawn.

- The HACC shall be invoiced for services rendered during the preceding month. ETHICS IN PURCHASING

Statement to Vendors

Recommendation of Purchases

It is the desire of the HACC to have all HACC employees and officials practice exemplary ethical behavior in the procurement of goods, materials, supplies, and services.

HACC officials and employees who recommend purchases shall not extend any favoritism to any vendor. Each recommended purchase should be based upon quality of the items, service, price, delivery, and other applicable factors in full compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et. seq.

Solicitation/Receipt of Gifts – Prohibited

HACC officials and employees are prohibited from soliciting and receiving funds, gifts, materials, goods, services, favors, and any other items of value from vendors doing business with the HACC or anyone proposing to do business with the HACC.

Vendor Responsibility

Offer of Gifts, Gratuities -- Prohibited

A county, municipality, independent district, HACC, or fire district is hereby authorized to establish by ordinance, resolution or regulation, as may be appropriate, measures limiting the awarding of public contracts therefrom to business entities that have made a contribution pursuant to P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-1 et seq.) and limiting the contributions that the holders of a contract can make during the term of a contract, notwithstanding the provisions and parameters of sections 1 through 12 of P.L.2004, c.19 (C.19:44A-20.2 et al.) and section 22 of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-22).

b. The provisions of P.L.2004, c.19 shall not be construed to supersede or preempt any ordinance, resolution or regulation of a unit of local government that limits political contributions by business entities performing or seeking to perform government contracts. Any ordinance, resolution or regulation in effect on the effective date of P.L.2004, c.19 shall remain in effect and those adopted after that effective date shall be valid and enforceable.

c. An ordinance, resolution or regulation adopted or promulgated as provided in this section shall be filed with the Secretary of State.

52:34-25 2. a. Not later than 10 days prior to entering into any contract having an anticipated value in excess of \$17,500, except for a contract that is required by law to be publicly advertised for bids, a State agency, county, municipality, independent district, HACC, or fire district shall require any business entity bidding thereon or negotiating therefor, to submit along with its bid or price quote, a list of political contributions as set forth in this subsection that are reportable by the recipient pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-1 et seq.) and that were made by the business entity during the preceding 12 month period, along with the date and amount of each contribution and the name of the recipient of each contribution. A business entity contracting with a State agency shall disclose contributions to any State, county, or municipal committee of a political party, legislative leadership committee, candidate committee of a candidate for, or holder of, a State elective office, or any continuing political committee. A business entity contracting with a county, municipality, independent district, other than an independent district that is a State agency, HACC, or fire district shall disclose contributions to: any State, county, or municipal committee of a political party; any legislative leadership committee; or any candidate committee of a candidate for, or holder of, an elective office of that public entity, of that county in which

that public entity is located, of another public entity within that county, or of a legislative district in which that public entity is located or, when the public entity is a county, of any legislative district which includes all or part of the county, or any continuing political committee.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to a contract when a public emergency requires the immediate delivery of goods or services.

b. When a business entity is a natural person, a contribution by that person's spouse or child, residing therewith, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity. When a business entity is other than a natural person, a contribution by any person or other business entity having an interest therein shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity. When a business entity is other than a natural person, a contribution by: all principals, partners, officers, or directors of the business entity or their spouses; any subsidiaries directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity; or any political organization organized under section 527 of the Internal Revenue Code that is directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity, other than a candidate committee, election fund, or political party committee, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity.

c. As used in this section:

"business entity" means a natural or legal person, business corporation, professional services corporation, limited liability company, partnership, limited partnership, business trust, association or any other legal commercial entity organized under the laws of this State or of any other state or foreign jurisdiction;

"interest" means the ownership or control of more than 10% of the profits or assets of a business entity or 10% of the stock in the case of a business entity that is a corporation for profit, as appropriate; and

"State agency" means any of the principal departments in the Executive Branch of the State Government, and any division, HACC, bureau, office, commission or other instrumentality within or created by such department, the Legislature of the State and any office, HACC, bureau or commission within or created by the Legislative Branch, and any independent State district, commission, instrumentality or agency.

d. Any business entity that fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be subject to a fine imposed by the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission in an amount to be determined by the commission which may be based upon the amount that the business entity failed to report.

19:44A-20.13 3. a. Any business entity making a contribution of money or any other thing of value, including an in-kind contribution, or pledge to make a contribution of any kind to a candidate for or the holder of any public office having ultimate responsibility for the awarding of public contracts, or to a political party committee, legislative leadership committee, political committee or continuing political committee, which has received in any calendar year \$50,000 or more in the aggregate through agreements or contracts with a public entity, shall file an annual disclosure statement with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission, established pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-5), setting forth all such contributions made by the business entity during the 12 months prior to the reporting deadline.

b. The commission shall prescribe forms and procedures for the reporting required in subsection a. of this section which shall include, but not be limited to:

(1) the name and mailing address of the business entity making the contribution, and the amount contributed during the 12 months prior to the reporting deadline;

(2) the name of the candidate for or the holder of any public office having ultimate responsibility for the awarding of public contracts, candidate committee, joint candidates committee, political party committee, legislative leadership committee, political committee or continuing political committee receiving the contribution; and

(3) the amount of money the business entity received from the public entity through contract or agreement, the dates, and information identifying each contract or agreement and describing the goods, services or equipment provided or property sold.

c. The commission shall maintain a list of such reports for public inspection both at its office and through its Internet site.

d. When a business entity is a natural person, a contribution by that person's spouse or child, residing therewith, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity. When a business entity is other than a natural person, a contribution by any person or other business entity having an interest therein shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity. When a business entity is other than a natural person, a contribution by: all principals, partners, officers, or directors of the business entity, or their spouses; any subsidiaries directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity; or any political organization organized under section 527 of the Internal Revenue Code that is directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity, other than a candidate committee, election fund, or political party committee, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity.

As used in this section:

"business entity" means a natural or legal person, business corporation, professional services corporation, limited liability company, partnership, limited partnership, business trust, association or any other legal commercial entity organized under the laws of this State or of any other state or foreign jurisdiction; and

"interest" means the ownership or control of more than 10% of the profits or assets of a business entity or 10% of the stock in the case of a business entity that is a corporation for profit, as appropriate.

e. Any business entity that fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be subject to a fine imposed by the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission in an amount to be determined by the commission which may be based upon the amount that the business entity failed to report.

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

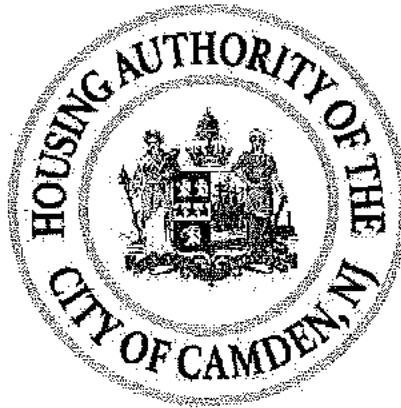

(b) Each signature on the bid is considered to be a certification by the signatory that the signatory--

(1) Is the person in the bidder's organization responsible for determining the prices being offered in this bid or proposal, and that the signatory has not participated and will not participate in any action contrary to subparagraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) above; or

(2) (i) Has been authorized, in writing, to act as agent for the following principals in certifying that those principals have not participated, and will not participate in any action contrary to subparagraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) above.
