

PUBLIC NOTICE – EMERGENCY HOUSING VOUCHERS (EHV)

The Housing Authority of the City of Camden (HACC) was awarded 43 Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV). The EHV program is a program authorized by the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act 2021 Public Law #1172. The ARP authorized the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to allocate 43 EHV's to HACC to assist individuals and families who are (1) homeless, (2) at risk of homelessness, (3) fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, or (4) recently homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having high risk of housing instability.

Emergency Housing Vouchers are only awarded by direct referral from the Southern New Jersey Continuum of Care (SNJCoC). In order to be eligible for an EHV, an individual or family must meet one of the four eligibility categories of: (1) homeless, (2) at risk of homelessness, (3) fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, or (4) recently homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having high risk of housing instability. The SNJCoC verifies eligibility of applicants.
